

MAY FIELD TRIP TO ST. JOHNS UNIVERSITY AT COLLEGEVILLE

The CMWG left the workshop at the May meeting for a trip to St. Johns sugar shack. But they weren't there for maple syrup making...they were able to see a portable sawmill in action.



Twenty members gathered on a field near the campus; one of the arborists of the St. John's woods, Con Brady, gave a short talk on the husbandry of the forest and described how the wood products it produces are used for campus needs.

We then watched semi-retired CPA Jeff Thompson demonstrate his <u>Wood Mizer</u> sawmill; he was sawing a basswood tree for canoe handles that would be produced at the St. John's woodshop.





Typical costs depend on the operator and mileage to the site. It is a reasonable given the difficult and possibly dangerous work spent loading and transporting personal logs to a big sawmill. It was another exciting field trip for the club thanks to Michael Roske and Michael Ross as they facilitated this adventure. MAY SAWMILL FIELD TRIP -(CONTINUED)



These types of portable band saw mills are widely used in rural areas of our northern forests. The tree lot owner does not need to transport his logs to an established saw mill.

These units travel and set up easily. Hydraulic lifts that are built in to one side of the unit, raises the logs up and into the saw line of the mill.





The mill horizontally saws the logs for initial dressing and quick inspection. Barked ends are carried to one side for burning or firewood or stickers for drying the lot. The squared logs are then sawn to desired thickness and set in another woodpile.

APRIL SHOW AND TELL INLAIDED TABLE-DESK ORGANIZER

Charlie Gunderson brought in a maple table with inlay and explained how he had created the "inlay." He first cut the curve he wanted in the top and lower piece, then, rather than bending the wood for the inlay, he simply cut narrow strips and forced the sides together, using lots of Titebond II and clan
