#### **Build a Small Sea Chest with Mike Siemsen**

This class, postponed for weather in January, was held February 8 & 9. Seven students took the class taught by Mike Siemsen. Mike Ross and Don Peterson assisted. This is the second time we have offered this class. The Sea Chest class was the first class we offered in our current shop facility. It was held September 9, 2017. The chest is built from a home center 1 X 12, 10 foot long pine board. No machines were used in building the chest. All work was done by hand. Everyone got an immediate warm-up sawing the pieces with hand saws.

The challenging part of the build is the angled dovetails. Mike expertly guided everyone through that. We were able to give the shop hand tools a good workout. I am happy to report the Narex chisels, mallets, the Veritas saws and marking gauges all performed very well.

# **January Meeting**

For the January meeting, we visited Grant Kaihoi's workshop. He gave a detailed presentation on live-edge woodworking, including the definition of "live-edge" (the outer edge of the tree perpendicular to the flat plane or surface); 2) sourcing the wood (Grant collects some "in the wild" and other pieces he buys as slabs that can cost as much as \$2,000 and more); 3) sawing logs on a bandsaw; 4) method for drying wood right after cutting to control moisture loss. (Grant treats his boards with Pentacryl (available at Amazon), then sticks them every 12", until they have reached 10% moisture); 5) flattening boards (he does this with routers and leveling bits; 6) design (the sky's the limit; Grant is inspired by the relationships between live edges and flat surfaces; 7) finishing: Grant uses Odie's Oil (www.odiesoil.com), a "non-toxic, food safe, one coat, naturally effective wood finish and stabilizer". We had great attendance and lots of questions. Thanks to Grant for sharing his workshop and expertise with us.
