Here is a gift that I recently completed and gave to Christine for her birthday. It is called The Footprints Poem. When selecting the wood for the background I wanted something that would have a warm color change to represent the water meeting the sand, Don Peterson suggested hickory. He couldn't have been more right with that recommendation. Before I laser engraved the text onto it I milled down the portion of the board where the ocean would be the thickness of a piece of glass, then I had the glass water cut to match the wavy profile and it is "inlayed" into it. After that was compete I started in on the frame. It is constructed from cherry with walnut splines in the corner for a bit of subtle aesthetics and strength. Finally I made some custom brass tabs to hold the poem in place. Christine was speechless when she opened such a special gift, which was the best part.

We had a couple items made by members that we didn't take the time to hear about or look at. We will catch up with those in January.


SawStop Table Saw

This class will cover the basics of selecting and using veneer, cutting a design from the veneer, assembling the pieces, and gluing and finishing the completed

picture. All materials and tools are included. The student will leave with the basic tools and supplies to continue working on an additional project of their own.

This Craft style Bookcase is designed to grace any setting in your home. It elegantly holds books, magazines, or art for display. Join us to build this project and learn a variety of skills and techniques for design, lay-out, and construction. We will build the case with through and stopped tenons for strength and looks. Discover how to rout and hand chop mortises and how to cut and fit tenons with a variety of machines and hand tools. The wedged tenons we will create are incredibly strong. Learn how to cut angled mortises and how to make your wedges on the band saw. After our joinery is complete, it's time for shaping and assembly. We will shape the side pieces and work with spoke shaves and rasps for fairing these curves. Learn hand planing techniques for flattening and smoothing our work. After assembly we will consider ideas for inlay let into our



sides. Watch how to make routing templates and how to make and inset and then carve and shape our inlay.





Bandsawn Boxes
