# **Charlie Gunderson**

### Bench

Made with red oak the top is a piece I had around from a project. Used the live edge. Size 24" long, 12" deep, 18" tall. Mortise & Tenon joints. Legs mortised though seat. Mortise & tenon joints are pinned with walnut dowels. Legs have walnut wedges in them. There are no metal fasteners in this bench. Finish is natural varnish.



# Mike Ross

I refinished our dining room table. It was about 40 years old with only the original "finish" on it and needed to be redone. It is solid red oak and walnut, so I was able to sand down to bare wood and then finished it with 3 coats of Sam Maloof's PolyOil finish and three coats of wipeon Poly.
