

#### **February Meeting**

The meeting topic in February was Making a Plan. Presenters included Devin Middendorf, Mark Voigt, and Tim Ziegler.

Devin covered woodworking drawing basics, orthographic projections, and three view drawing. He provided a quick overview of CAD programs available and did a demo with Solidworks. Draftsight is a 2D CAD program available for free. 3D programs include AutoCad, Solidworks, Fusion 360, and Sketch-up. None of the 3D programs are free at this time.

Mark talked about communicating by drawing and presented a low-tech approach using a drawing board, rulers, and triangles. He also covered using graph paper, tracing plans, and using transfer or carbon paper. Mark also covered the steps in developing drawing skills and methods of creating plans.

Tim gave us the professional point of view. He uses everything from hand drawn sketches to CAD drawings on his projects. He stressed how important drawings are in communicating with customers.

Our second open shop event was held Thursday, March 7. We had a successful night. Projects worked on included a sled for cutting box joints, milling wood for a cutting board project, chisel sharpening, and finishing one of the nightstand organizers. It is a great opportunity to use the club tools and network with your fellow woodworkers.

#### **Beyond the Basics Woodworking Class**

The Beyond the Basics Woodworking class wrapped up February 26. This class ran for three Tuesday nights in February. Each class was three hours long. Instructed by Mark Voigt, the class project was a nightstand organizer made out of walnut. In order to complete the class in three sessions Mark had pre-milled all the walnut. Mark provided a complete set of plans that included a cut list and procedures. The case and drop in tray were the focus of the first two sessions. The drop in tray was finished with flocking. The flocking is a colored fiber that is sprayed on to wet paint. It provides a velvety, durable finish. The third session was spent on drawer assembly and final assembly. The drawer repeated many of the construction techniques learned in the first two sessions and served to reinforce those lessons. The drawer and the back joints of the case were joined with a drawer lock joint made on the router table.

This class integrated nicely with our current monthly meeting topics. The monthly meetings in 2019 are covering the phases of a project from deciding what to make through finishing. The example project is a box in all its forms.


