## **Greetings Woodworkers**

At our September meeting we took a tour of Herbst Lumber Company in Milaca. This was the first time I toured a lumber mill, so it was interesting to see the whole process of drying the wood to a stable moisture. In addition to drying and selling rough lumber they also have processing available; boards can get planed down to your specifications. They are also able to provide wide panel glue up, time saving, and custom molding. If you are interested in any of their services you can call them at 320-293-9377.


# Introduction to Woodworking

# **Michael Cullen Bandsaw Box Class**

Michael Cullen, a renowned furnituremaker from Petaluma, California, was at the Studio the week of September 17th teaching his unique method of creating bandsaw boxes. Making the boxes is a bit of a puzzle, especially with the first box a person creates, but with Michael's guidance and examples, everyone was busy creating really interesting boxes by the second day of the class.

Along with making the box, Michael also taught the students how to embellish the boxes with carvings. Michael had numerous examples of textures and patterns he uses in his work and showed the class how, with a few basic carving tools, these embellishments can change a plain box into a sculptural work of art.

On the first day of class everyone created a color-board with samples of all the different color milk paints that would be used on the boxes during the class. Milk paint is great fun to work with and layering the colors can result in some outstanding results. The class experimented with a product that creates an antique-looking "crackled" surface. Great fun!

The week was a great success with all the students producing several boxes. The Studio was buzzing with activity all week and our benches and equipment made the whole process fun, efficient, and productive. Our first week-long class was a great success.


