






October meeting

The October meeting demonstration was on band saw set-up by Rollie Johnson. Rollie reviewed what to look for in a bandsaw. He covered where to place the blade on the tires, how to set up top and bottom guides, and proper blade tension. Rollie recommends blades from SuperCut bandsaw blades at supercutbandsaw.com. Specifically for re-sawing he recommends their Woodsaver Plus variable pitch blade.

Sharpening and Using Handsaws Class

with Mike Siemsen

Held Saturday and Sunday, October 2 & 3, 2021.

Six students attended this class by Mike Seimsen. Everyone either brought their own saws to sharpen or Mike had a good selection of used saws for sale. Mike covered what to look for when buying a used saw, saw terminology, and the tools needed for saw sharpening during day one. Everyone sharpened at least two saws. We started with a rip saw. The class learned about jointing the saw teeth, shaping the teeth, and sharpening the teeth. A crosscut saw was covered next which was very similar to the rip with the addition of fleam angle.

On day two we used our newly sharpened saws to make two sawhorses out of pine. Everyone was successful in sharpening the saws and completing two sawhorses.

Students learned about safely using the tablesaw, jointer, band saw, planer, various sanders, and hand tools. A highlight of the project was the handle design that required a table sawn cove molding.

Tool Making Workshop with Mike Siemsen

Saturday and Sunday, January 22-23, 9am to 4pm Tech Center, Waite Park Instructor—Mike Siemsen

We will be making a traditional double screw vise as shown in Randal Holme and Moxon; also a mallet, a marking gauge, and a marking knife. You will use hand tools to make these four very useful items for your shop and gain the ability to make more of them as needed.

Introduction to Basic Woodworking

Students will build a keepsake box over the course of four lessons. The box will feature miter joints, and a lift off lid. Constructing the box will provide an application of lessons on shop and machine safety, machine operation, wood selection, joinery, gluing and clamping, and finishing.

Making Tablesaw Jigs & Fixtures with Bob Van Dyke—3 days

April 4, 5, & 6, 2022 Techcenter, Waite Park Instructor—Bob VanDyke

The idea of making jigs and fixtures for the tablesaw is always one that creates a lot of debate. Some people insist that they are not worth it and "just do it by hand" while other people love coming up with intricate fixtures that do a specific job really well. Bob's approach is somewhere in the middle- will the jig be useful enough to be used over & over again and is it better than one that can be easily purchased? This class is Not a beginning tablesaw class. Participants must have some working experience with tablesaws & routers. Note: because of the design of the jigs for the table saw you must have a table saw with a Biessemeyer type fence. Bench top or "Job site" saws will not work with these jigs.

Build a Miter Fold & Veneered Box with Bob Van Dyke- 3 days

If you have ever done any re-sawing then you know how cool a book matched panel can be. In this hands-on class students will each make a



small "Miter Fold" box out of walnut and while doing that we will explore the endless possibilities of working with veneer to create a striking top for the box.
